## **2008 Interstate Fair**

The 2008 Spokane Interstate Fair photography competition was an outstanding event because of the participation of many of the club members in putting the display together. The competition had 548 prints, entered by 110 individuals. It was a bit disappointing that more club members did not enter, as this is a good way to have your work seen by thousands.

Volunteers from the club assisted in every aspect of preparing and presenting the exhibit, beginning with the judging of the prints with several helpers, on set-up day. The day before fair opening, we had four helpers who put in over six hours of work hanging the prints on the walls and racks. This is a big job as some of the prints are around eight feet off of the floor, on the wall! It also had another peril, as the pins they used to mount the prints are sharp!

The next big job was that of the booth hosts who provided the daily oversight of the exhibit, answered questions, solicited peoples choice votes, and generally represented the camera club on photography. This was a very time consuming activity and one which needs more volunteers in the future to avoid having to have members serve on several days, as was the case for the past several years. The booth host pulls a six hour shift in exchange for a ticket to the fair, close up parking and the opportunity to visit the rest of the fair before or after their booth tour is over. A pretty good deal in all!

Finally, another group, or should I say most of the same volunteers from the other activities, assisted in the take down of the exhibit. Because of the concerted effort of that group, all 548 prints were down in about 30 minutes, with the bagging and tagging of them for return to the fair office taking another 45 minutes. A very well done job!

The exhibit of prints was very well received by the visitors to the fair, with many of them expressing awe at the magnitude of the display. The club should be very proud of their effort to put on this display for the community, as it is a great promoter of photography, and second to none in the Inland Empire area! -- *LeRoy and Vicki Nielsen, Fair Superintendents*
