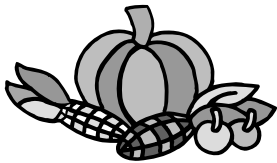

Shooting waterfalls

(September Subject of the Month)

When you are shooting water in motion, shutter speed becomes a critical issue. If you want a sense of motion, you must use slower shutter speeds to give a blur effect. With waterfalls, put the camera on a tripod and use a variety of shutter speeds from 1/125 second to one second. At one second the water becomes almost all white and very soft.

If the waterfall is in bright sunlight you will need to use slow film and perhaps a polarizing or neutral density filter in order to get slow shutter speeds.
